Domestic Violence Advocacy and Victim Support Service (Karratha)

Our Domestic Violence Advocacy and Victim Support Service is available to all women who are experiencing family and/or domestic violence. It provides information, referrals and assistance in a secure, confidential setting where you are safe to tell your story.

This service acts as an important tool to help overcome trauma, recover and rebuild a life after abuse. Our support workers can assist with:

- early intervention and response
- advocacy
- violence restraining order applications
- court support and legal advice and representation from our solicitors
- · housing and emergency accommodation
- information and referrals to other community and support services

Keeping Women Safe in their Homes (South Hedland)

Keeping Women Safe (KWS) is an early intervention and prevention strategy that helps keep women and children from becoming homeless and improves safety following family and domestic violence. Our support workers help women to stay in their homes, or a home of their choosing, when it is safe and appropriate for them to do so.

Domestic Violence Outreach (South Hedland)

Our Domestic Violence Outreach (DVO) service is aimed at breaking the cycle of family and domestic violence. Our Support Workers assist with:

- risk assessments
- safety planning
- welfare, safety and security checks
- linking you to a wide range of services that can assist you in addressing your needs
